

Waverly/Comstock Restriping Work Begins Next Week

Beginning on May 31 and running through June 2, road restriping work will take place along portions of Waverly and Comstock avenues. The restriping, being done by Syracuse University contractors in conjunction with the City of Syracuse and CENTRO, will help to better facilitate bus traffic as work begins on the University Place Promenade project.

As part of the restriping, bike lanes along Waverly and Comstock avenues will be converted from the two-way cycle track currently in use into a single one-way track heading eastbound on Waverly Avenue and southbound on Comstock Avenue. Work crews on the scene will help traffic to move safely and efficiently.

Beginning Friday, June 3, CENTRO bus routes that previously included stops along University Place will instead utilize new bus stops located on Comstock and Waverly avenues. CENTRO riders seeking to access destinations along University Place, including Bird Library, the Newhouse School of Public Communications and the Schine Student Center, can now access those destinations directly from stops along Waverly Avenue. New bus stops will be added in both directions on Waverly Avenue at Bird Library, on Comstock Avenue at Ernie Davis Hall, and at South Crouse Avenue near Crouse Hinds Hall. During the project, all entrances to the Syracuse University campus will remain open and accessible.
