MINER ANNOUNCES RESULTS OF MORE CORNER STORE INSPECTIONS

SYRACUSE, N.Y. – Following a citywide crackdown on corner stores across the City of Syracuse yesterday, Mayor Stephanie A. Miner has announced the final results of the remaining inspections.

“Yesterday was a successful start to this coordinated effort,” said **Mayor Stephanie A. Miner**. “We will continue to bring city and county resources to bear to assure corner stores operate in compliance with all safety and health regulations. Store owners who run clean operations will have nothing to fear going forward. For those who don’t, the city will look to shut down their operations until they bring those stores up to common sense safety and health standards.”

“Last night as I drove through the City, I was simply amazed at the peace and quiet on our streets around the stores,” said **Councilor-at-Large Helen**. “I am so pleased at the success of this effort and I look forward to working with Mayor Miner to address more problem stores.”

24 hour shutdown notices were given to:

- **Johnny 5’s, 1012 Park Street**, where a broken sprinkler (ANSUL) system, blocked exits, and broken sewer systems were discovered. They were also cited for failure to property ground their electrical service and a faulty fire alarm system.

The following facilities passed their inspections:

- **9 Eleven Grocery, 1209-17 Lodi Street**
- **Kleen Foods, 500 Catherine Street**
- **All American Market, 401 Pond Street**

Additionally, code violations for **Lexington Market, 101 Lexington Avenue** are now available.
