CITY OF SYRACUSE ANNOUNCES INSTALLATION OF STOP SIGNS AT BUTTERNUT CIRCLE

SYRACUSE, N.Y. – The City of Syracuse announced today it will not replace traffic signals which were recently removed in the Butternut Circle/Duguid Park area following an accident which took the signal out of service. This decision had been considered for a number of years and received considerable study and public input.

Once in the intersection, vehicles will have the right of way until they leave the intersection. Warning signs have been placed with stop signs to inform drivers that traffic in the intersection does not stop.

Stop bars on Grant Avenue and the southbound lane of Butternut Street have been recently refreshed and are appropriately located where they are. The stop bar on northbound Butternut has not been refreshed since there is currently no traffic signal stop control on that approach and therefore, that stop bar will need to be installed. The City will continue to monitor this intersection and make changes as needed.
