

PILOT RESOLUTION

A regular meeting of the City of Syracuse Industrial Development Agency was convened in public session on March 19, 2019 at 8:00 o'clock a.m., local time, in the Common Council Chambers, City Hall, 233 East Washington Street, Syracuse, New York.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman and upon roll being called, the following members of the Agency were:

The following resolution was offered by Kenneth Kinsey and seconded by Rickey T. Brown:

RESOLUTION APPROVING AN PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAX SCHEDULE AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF CERTAIN DOCUMENTS BY THE AGENCY IN CONNECTION WITH A PILOT AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the City of Syracuse Industrial Development Agency (the "**Agency**") is authorized and empowered by Title 1 of Article 18-A of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York (the "**State**"), as amended, together with Chapter 641 of the Laws of 1979 of the State of New York, as amended from time to time (collectively, the "**Act**") to promote, develop, encourage and assist in the acquiring, constructing, reconstructing, improving, maintaining, equipping and furnishing of industrial, manufacturing, warehousing, commercial, research and recreation facilities, including industrial pollution control facilities, railroad facilities and certain horse racing facilities, for the purpose of promoting, attracting, encouraging and developing recreation and economically sound commerce and industry to advance the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the people of the State, to improve their recreation opportunities, prosperity and standard of living, and to prevent unemployment and economic deterioration; and

WHEREAS, to accomplish its stated purposes, the Agency is authorized and empowered under the Act to acquire, lease and sell real property and grant financial assistance in connection with one or more "projects" (as defined in the Act); and by application dated September 27, 2017, as supplemented in March, 2019 (collectively, the "**Application**"), Salina 1st, LLC, or an entity to be formed (the "**Company**"), requested the Agency undertake a project (the "**Project**")

consisting of: (A)(i) the acquisition of an interest in approximately 82,534 square feet of vacant land located at 1081 South Salina Street in the City of Syracuse, New York (the "**Land**"); (ii) the construction of one or two buildings (to be determined in accordance with applicable zoning requirements), comprising an aggregate of 52,000 square feet to house: (a) approximately 23,400 sq. ft. of commercial and light manufacturing space on the first floor; and (b) approximately 11,250 sq. ft. of commercial office space (on the second and third floors) and approximately 11,250 sq. ft. of mixed income residential units (on the fourth and fifth floors) and approximately 5,700 sq. ft. of retail space (located on the first floor); and (c) the creation of approximately 55 surface parking spots and approximately 30,000 square feet of green space; all located on the Land (collectively, the "**Facility**"); (iii) the acquisition and installation in and at the Land and Facility of furniture, fixtures and equipment, including but not limited to green roofs, bio retention areas, solar panels (the "**Equipment**" and together with the Land and the Facility, the "**Project Facility**"); (B) the granting of certain financial assistance in the form of exemptions from real property tax, State and local sales and use tax and mortgage recording tax (as limited by Section 874 of the General Municipal Law) (collectively the "**Financial Assistance**"); (C) the appointment of the Company or its designee as an agent of the Agency in connection with the acquisition, construction, equipping and completion of the Project Facility; and (D) the lease or sale of the Land from the Agency to the Company pursuant to a lease or sale agreement; the lease of the Land from the Company to the Agency pursuant to a lease agreement; the acquisition of an interest in the Equipment pursuant to a bill of sale from the Company to the Agency; and the sublease of the Project Facility back to the Company pursuant to a sublease agreement; and

WHEREAS, on November 21, 2017, the Agency resolved to classify a certain project as an Unlisted Action pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law of the State of New York, as amended, and the regulations of the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York promulgated thereunder (collectively referred to hereinafter as "**SEQRA**") and determined that the action will not have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2019, the Agency further resolved to take official action toward the acquisition, construction, equipping and completion of the Project (the "**Amended Inducement Resolution**"); and

WHEREAS, as part of the Financial Assistance, the Company requested the Agency consider a payment in lieu of tax schedule, (the "**PILOT**"), as more fully described on **Exhibit "A"** attached hereto, which schedule conforms with the Agency's Uniform Tax Exemption Policy ("**UTEP**") established pursuant to General Municipal Law Section 874(4); and

WHEREAS, the Project is located in the Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Area (the "**NRSA**") of the City of Syracuse (the "**City**") as described by the City's Department of Neighborhood & Business Development's Fifth Annual Action Plan which was incorporated into the City's Consolidated Plan 2015-2019; and

WHEREAS, inclusion in the NRSA qualifies the Project for a fifteen (15) year priority commercial and residential payment in lieu of taxes schedule in accordance with the Agency's UTEP;

WHEREAS, the Agency has given due consideration to the Application and to

representations by the Company that the proposed PILOT, as part of the Financial Assistance: (i) will induce the Company to develop the Project Facility in the City of Syracuse; and (ii) will not result in the removal of a commercial, industrial or manufacturing plant or facility of the Company or any other proposed occupant of the Project Facility from one area of the State to another area of the State or in the abandonment of one or more plants or facilities of the Company or any other proposed occupant of the Project Facility located in the State, except as may be permitted by the Act; (iii) undertaking the Project will advance job opportunities in the State and promote the general prosperity and economic welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Syracuse in furtherance of the purposes of the Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the members of the City of Syracuse Industrial Development Agency, as follows:

(1) Based upon the representations made by the Company to the Agency, and the reasons presented by the Company in support of its request for the PILOT schedule, the Agency hereby approves and the (Vice) Chairman and Executive Director, acting individually, are each authorized to execute and deliver a PILOT agreement (the "**PILOT Agreement**") providing for the payment schedule attached as **Exhibit "A"** hereto, all in such form and substance as shall be substantially the same as approved by the Agency for other similar transactions and consistent with this Resolution and as approved by the Chairman or Vice Chairman of the Agency upon the advice of counsel to the Agency. As a condition to the execution and delivery of the PILOT Agreement, the Company shall execute and deliver all of the Lease Documents (as defined in the Inducement Resolution) and the Final Appointment shall be in place.

(2) The (Vice) Chairman and/or Executive Director, acting individually, are each hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the Agency, to execute and deliver the documents and agreements identified herein and any and all such additional certificates, instruments, documents or affidavits, to pay any such other fees, charges and expenses, to make such other changes, omissions, insertions, revisions, or amendments to the documents referred to herein as the (Vice)Chairman shall approve, and to do and cause to be done any such other acts and things, as they determine, on advice of counsel to the Agency, may be necessary or desirable to consummate the transactions contemplated by this Resolution.

(3) No covenant, stipulation, obligation or agreement contained in this resolution or any document referred to above shall be deemed to be the covenant, stipulation, obligation or agreement of any member, officer, agent or employee of the Agency in his or her individual capacity. Neither the members nor officers of the Agency, nor any person executing any documents referred to above on behalf of the Agency, shall be liable thereon or be subject to any personal liability or accountability by reason of the execution or delivery thereof.

(4) The Secretary and/or the Executive Director of the Agency are hereby authorized to distribute copies of this Resolution to the Company and to do such further things or perform such acts as may be necessary or convenient to implement the provisions of this Resolution.

(5) This Resolution shall take effect immediately, but is subject to execution by the Company of a PILOT Agreement and the Agreement (as defined in the Inducement Resolution) and

all other resolutions and other related documents adopted and/or approved by the Agency and/or as set forth herein.

(6) A copy of this Resolution, together with the attachments hereto, shall be placed on file in the office of the Agency where the same shall be available for public inspection during business hours.

The question of the adoption of the foregoing Resolution was duly put to vote on a roll call, which resulted as follows:


