

I. Attendance

II. Meeting called to order at 12:00 p.m.

K. Auwaerter reported that all of the agenda items had been reviewed with the applicants at the July 25, 2017 meeting. However, because there was no quorum, the Commission needed to hold this Special Meeting to act on the applications. SPAC 17-09 *A Feeling Like Chaos*, Suné Woods (UVP). B. Doucette made a motion to approve the application as submitted, which was seconded by N. Keefe Rhodes. The motion passed unanimously.

SPAC 17-10 *Water Way*, Various (UVP). B. Doucette made a motion to approve the application as submitted, which was seconded by N. Keefe Rhodes. The motion passed unanimously.

SPAC 17-11 *Community Garden Mural*, Judy Denham. B. Doucette made a motion to approve the application as submitted, which was seconded by N. Keefe Rhodes. The motion passed unanimously.

SPAC 17-12 *Paint the Town*, Brendan Rose. B. Doucette made a motion to approve the application as submitted, which was seconded by N. Keefe Rhodes. The motion passed unanimously.

PAC 17-13 *Canal Crossings*, Various. Ryan Wood (Public Art Task Force) was present to provide revised location information for the mural project. K. Auwaerter explained that the Commissioner of Public Works had indicated that he could approve the project if the murals were painted mid-block along Water Street and not in the intersections. R. Wood presented the revised application indicating that five of the murals -- "Balance Forward", "Guiding the Canal", "In the Water", "Tidal Wave" and "Journey Through the Salt City" -- would be painted within the 200 and 300 blocks of Water Street. In addition, the mural "Paper Ships" is proposed for the 100 block of E. Onondaga in front of the Hotel Syracuse, which is the headquarters for the International Canals Conference. R. Wood indicated that the Hotel was in favor of the project and a letter was forthcoming. However, the location has not been approved by DPW yet. B. Doucette made a motion to approve the application with the condition that the Department of Public Works provides its approval of the location of "Paper Ships" in front of the Hotel Syracuse. The motion was seconded by N. Keefe Rhodes and the motion passed unanimously.
