- 🐾 Sterilized pets live longer, healthier lives.
- 🐾 Sterilized pets make better, more affectionate companions, and are less likely to roam or fight.
- 🐾 Sterilized cats are less likely to spray and mark their territory.
- 🐾 Sterilized animals can exhibit fewer behavioral problems than those who are not spayed or neutered.
- 🐾 Females in heat often cry incessantly and attract unwanted males.
- 🐾 Sterilization saves lives by reducing pet overpopulation and the number of unwanted animals that find their way into local shelters and rescues.

SPAY & NEUTER SYRACUSE

Spay and Neuter Syracuse (SANS) is a non-profit low-cost spay and neuter clinic. Our mission is to address pet overpopulation in Central New York by providing low-cost spay and neuter services for pets that belong to low-income families, students, veterans, animal rescuers, and for homeless animals including feral cats.

HOW SANS WORKS

All animals scheduled for surgery will receive an examination by our staff veterinarian. If our veterinarian finds that the animal's health is too poor to undergo surgery, it is postponed and the animal may be referred to a local veterinarian for specialized care. In addition to a pre-surgical examination, animals also receive a rabies vaccine, a feline distemper combination vaccine and a one-month application of flea treatment.



HUMANE EDUCATION

As part of our mission, SANS provides humane education to the public about responsible pet care, the importance and advantages of spaying and neutering, as well as FeLV/FIV testing. We believe in continued long-term health care for animals and provide a list of local veterinary practices to our clients to encourage future care.



ABOUT THE PROCEDURES

Animals are anesthetized for spay and neutering procedures. The surgery is performed by our skilled licensed veterinarians and assisted by licensed veterinary technicians. After surgery, animals are closely monitored by our trained staff in a warm and comfortable recovery environment. All pets are picked up by their caretakers at the end of the clinic day.
